### [Focus on: RCS-101 - The Carpentry Course for Building Maintenance Students](#) By Neil Cuomo

The Building Maintenance Training Program offered at QBITTI is made up of 6 Sub-Courses. They are:

- MAF-101**-Masonry, Tiling Basics, Flooring Installation
- PRF-101**-Painting, Priming, Rigging and Fencing
- BMT-201**-Stripping, Waxing, Sealing Floors and Electricity
- DMS-101**-Construction Math, Plans, Bldg Codes, OSHA
- BPS-101**-Basic Plumbing, DWV, Fixture Installation
- RCS-101** - Remedial Carpentry Systems.

Our next **RCS-101** begins on March 12, and is designed to train entry-level students in the basics of construction carpentry. Building Maintenance students need basic carpentry skills to be able to complete construction projects like home renovations and commercial applications. Topics in this course include knowledge of structural members, use of carpentry tools, wall, floor and roof framing, installing windows and doors, site layout, materials handling, and interpreting building plans. Hands-on projects include building mock-up 1/4 scale single story houses, building full size walls, installing windows and doors to spec, and a personal project. Graduates of our course have gone on to become Apprentices, Journeymen, Lead Carpenters and even Foremen.

Here is a picture of one of the single story mock-ups built by our Building Maintenance students during the RCS-101 Class.

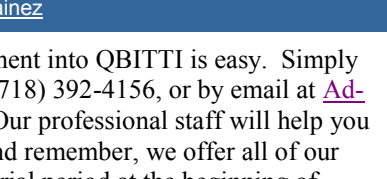


Here is a picture of one of our students installing a switch and light fixture in the Electricians Helper course.

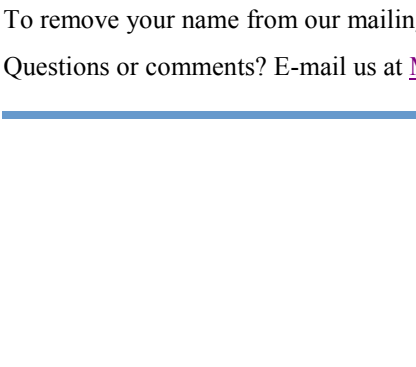
