On 4/4/2012 we begin another DMS-101 training module. Students enrolled in either the Electricians' or Plumbers' Helper, or the Building Maintenance Training programs must take this course as part of their graduation requirements. However, this course is open to all of our students because of the importance of its academic content. Specifically, the [OSHA-10](#) Safety Course is taught during this training module. As most know, the City of NY requires that all personnel on an active worksite must first pass an [OSHA-10](#) Safety course. QBITTI offers this course free of charge to its matriculated students, and has made the course available to non-matriculated students for a nominal fee. In addition to OSHA training, the DMS course also teaches about building codes, construction math and dimensioning and measuring. The next two OSHA-10 courses begin on 4/4/2012 and 7/7/2012 respectively. The 4/4 course is almost filled, with a few slots are still available. The 7/7 course has plenty of openings. 


